

# Village of Prairie du Sac Recycling Requirements

Effective January 1, 2002

To meet state recycling requirements, the Village of Prairie du Sac enacted a recycling ordinance which became effective on January 1, 1995, which made it mandatory to recycle certain items, add fines for noncompliance, identify new responsibilities for owners/managers of multi-family buildings and non-residential buildings, and for developers/builders. Copies of the recycling ordinance may be obtained (at cost) at the Village Hall. **Tim's Trucking will pick up recycling material on Tuesdays.**

**NOTE 2010 CHANGES: Televisions & Monitors (any size) \$.30 per pound, Cell Phones \$.10 per pound, Misc Electronics \$5.00 each, Household Batteries \$5.00 per pound.**

**ATTN HUNTERS: Animal Carcass will no longer be picked up.**

**Mandatory Recycling** (these items may be placed in a clear plastic bag together)

Aluminum	Steel containers
Glass	Bi-metal containers
Plastics labeled #1 - #7	

**Corrugated Cardboard**

Corrugated cardboard must be bundled separately, broken down flat, tied securely both ways, no greater than 10 inches high or 40 lbs. and 3x3 bundle.

**Newspapers**

Newspapers must be bundled separately, tied securely both ways, no greater than 10 inches high or 40 lbs.

**Magazines**

Magazines must be bundled separately, tied securely both ways, no greater than 10 inches high or 40 lbs.

**Foam Polystyrene**

Foam polystyrene should be bagged separately.

**Office Paper**

Office paper should be bagged separately.

**Yard Waste**

Yard waste may not be deposited in the landfills. The Village will continue to collect yard waste separately from trash and use in the Compost Centers compost-mulch pile. Residents are urged to re-use leaves and grass clippings as mulch in the yard.

**Multifamily Dwellings**

Owners/managers of multi-family dwellings (5 units or more) must provide separate containers for the regular collection of recycled materials outside, and wherever practicable, and within the building(s). Additionally, the owner/manager must notify new tenants of the recycling requirements and all tenants annually.

**Commercial, Retail, Industrial, Institutional Facilities and Properties**

Owners/managers of non-residential facilities must provide adequate, separate containers for recyclable materials. Owners/managers must also notify, at least semi-annually, all users, lessees and occupants of these properties about the recycling requirements.

**Developers and Builders**

Developers or builders of residential buildings with 5 units or more, or an office or commercial building in the Village must make space considerations for recycling containers within the building, in each apartment, on every floor, or in a central area within the building. Additionally, a separate structure for recyclable material must be established on the grounds accessible to collection vehicles. This requirement shall be part of the inspection requirements of the Building Inspector for new construction.
