

**PUBLIC NOTICE TO ALL CUSTOMERS OF PRAIRIE DU SAC MUNICIPAL WATER UTILITY**

The Prairie du Sac Municipal Water Utility has filed an application with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW) to increase water rates. The increase is necessary due to increased operating expenses and water main replacements since the last water rate case in 2011.

The total increase in water revenues requested is \$183,378 which will result in an estimated overall rate increase of 30% over the water utility's present revenues. If the request is granted, the water bill for general service for an average residential customer with a 5/8-inch or 3/4-inch meter who uses 4,500 gallons of water per month will increase from \$18.05 to \$23.30, or 29%.

When the public fire protection charge is included, the total water bill for an average residential customer with a 5/8-inch or 3/4-inch meter who uses 4,500 gallons of water per month will increase from \$25.35 to \$32.09, or 27% overall.

A telephonic public hearing on the application has been scheduled for Thursday, June 16, 2016, at 11:00 a.m. in the Village Board Room at the Prairie du Sac Village Hall, 335 Galena Street, Prairie du Sac, Wisconsin. Scheduling questions regarding this hearing may be directed to the PSCW at (608) 266-3766.

A person may testify in this proceeding without becoming a party and without attorney representation. A person may submit this testimony in one of the following ways:

- **Web Comment.** Go to the PSCW's web site at <http://psc.wi.gov>, click on the "Public Comments" button on the side menu bar. On the next page select the "File a comment" link that appears for docket number 4830-WR-106. Web comments shall be received no later than the day before the hearing.
- **Oral Comment.** Spoken testimony at the public hearing session.
- **Written Comment.** Instead of speaking at the hearing, write out a comment and submit it at the public hearing session.
- **Mail Comment.** All comments submitted by U.S. mail shall be received no later than the day before the hearing and shall be addressed to: Docket 4830-WR-106 Comments, Public Service Commission, P.O. Box 7854, Madison, WI 53707-7854.

The PSCW intends to webcast this hearing live on the PSCW's web site at <http://psc.wi.gov> under the "PSC Live Broadcast" button.

### What you need to know about Fireworks



**Legal Without A Permit:** State law allows the sale, possession and use, without a permit, of sparklers not exceeding 36 inches in length, stationary cones and fountains, toy snakes, smoke bombs, caps, noisemakers, confetti poppers with less than ¼ grain of explosive mixture, and novelty devices that spin or move on the ground. Wis. Stat. § 167.10(1). There is no age restriction on sale, possession or use of these devices and the statute does not classify them as fireworks. Local ordinances may be more restrictive than state statutes and may prohibit any of these items or limit

their sale or use. These are the only kinds of "fireworks," as that word is commonly used, that a person may use or possess without a permit or that may be sold to a person who does not have a permit.

**Illegal Without A Permit:** Possessing or using any other fireworks, including, for example, firecrackers, roman candles, bottle rockets and mortars, in Wisconsin without a valid permit is illegal. Wis. Stat. § 167.10(3). A commonly used rule of thumb is that a permit is required if the device explodes or leaves the ground. The sale of these restricted fireworks to a resident of this state without a valid permit is also illegal. Wis. Stat. § 167.10(2)
