

### Things to Know When Planning Garage Sales, Yard Sales and Similar Merchandise Sales

1. Garage/Yard sale signs may not have an area more than six sq. ft. with a maximum of two faces and shall list the address of the sale.
2. No garage sale sign may be located on utility poles, traffic signs, trees, private property without owner's permission or within the public right-of-way (this includes the terrace area or area between the sidewalk and curb, where there is no sidewalk, the area from the curb line to the edge of the right-of-way, approximately 12-13 ft., shall be deemed to be a terrace area). Signs improperly placed will be removed without

warning.



3. No garage sale sign shall be displayed more than one day before the sale or one day following the sale.
4. No more than one garage sale sign may be located at the sale site and no more than two garage sale signs may be located off the site, except that two signs are permitted on corner lots, one facing each street.
5. Garage sales may be conducted between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. A sale shall last no longer than four consecutive days. Sales may be held no more than twice per year at any residence, and for a total of not more than six days in that year.

### Parking/Storage of Recreational Vehicles and Trailers

The Village's Code of Ordinances allows parking of these campers, RV's, snowmobiles, ATV, boats and similar recreational vehicles inside any enclosed structure that conforms to zoning requirements. Parking is also permitted outside in the side yard or rear yard provided it is not nearer than six feet to the lot line. Parking is not permitted in the front yard which is the part of the lot between the front lot line and the front of the principal building on the lot, and extended to both lot lines. The recreational vehicle or trailer is permitted outside on a hard surface or well-drained gravel driveway, provided: (1) that space is not available in the rear yard or side yard, or there is no reasonable access to either side yard or rear yard; (2) a corner lot is always deemed to have reasonable access to the rear yard; (3) a fence is not necessarily deemed to prevent reasonable access; (4) inside parking is not possible;

(5) the unit is parked perpendicular to the front curb and is at least five feet from the front property line and does not extend over the public sidewalk or public right-of-way.

A unit may be parked anywhere on the private premises during active loading or unloading. Otherwise parking is permitted only for storage purposes; except for overnight sleeping for a maximum of fourteen days in any one calendar year (cooking inside the unit is not permitted at any time). The parked unit shall be owned by the resident on whose property the unit is parked for storage.

The Village's Code of Ordinances states recreational vehicles and trailers may not park longer than forty-eight (48) hours on a street without a permit obtained from the Village. This temporary permit shall allow the permittee to park on a Village street for up to five (5) days for a \$10.00 fee.

**Recycle your Fluorescent Lamps in Prairie du Sac!**

Prairie du Sac Utilities, in collaboration with Tim's Trucking, offers a lamp recycling service for customers disposing of lamps and ballasts. Fluorescent lamps, like CFLs and fluorescent tubes, contain mercury so properly managing their disposal is critical for public health and the environment.

Prairie du Sac Utilities offers free lamp recycling for residential customers (limit 10 lamps per customer). Prairie du Sac business customers and residential customers outside of Prairie du Sac can also take advantage of this program on a "pay per bulb" basis.

Through our power supplier, WPPI Energy, the utility contracts with a licensed lamp recycler for collection of these hazardous materials. Because the contrac-

tor serves all 51 locally owned electric utility members of WPPI Energy, they offer very competitive prices for their service. The utility provides this service at-cost and passes cost savings on to you.
