
2016 ELECTION DATES

Nov. 8, 2016 - General Election

Polls are open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Please remember to register if there is a change of name or address. You will need proof of residency when registering to vote.

At all elections now in Wisconsin, voters must show an acceptable photo ID before a ballot will be provided. Please see prairiedusac.net for additional information.



Leaf Collection

Loose leaves and grass clippings will be picked up using the leaf vacuum October 1 thru November 15 (dependent upon the weather and if leaves are falling). Loose leaves and grass clippings should be placed in the tree bank, upon the terrace, not in the gutter or street. Items placed in the street can be washed by rain into the storm sewers causing blockage or flooding or can become a traffic hazard.

Pick-up crews begin on one end of the Village and make a complete pass through the entire Village, repeating the route several times during the season. There are no set days of when they will be in any particular neighborhood. It may take several days for crews to make it through the entire Village, depending on the amount of leaves and grass clippings that are out in the neighborhoods before yours. Therefore, the Village asks for your

patience as leaves may sit on the terrace for several days. Snow and rain may affect pick-up. Before October 1 and after November 15, leaves and grass clippings must be bagged for pickup.

FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Village of Prairie du Sac Water Utility tentatively plans to flush fire hydrants September 26 to October 14, 2016, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. It may be necessary to adjust these dates due to weather conditions. The process of periodically “flushing” fire hydrants is an important preventative maintenance activity to insure the integrity of the water system and deliver the highest quality water to our customers. The Village flushes hydrants twice a year, usually in the spring and fall. Hydrant flushing serves the following purposes:



- Flushes sediments from mainline pipes, which enhances water quality.
- Verifies the proper operation of fire hydrants and valves.
- Aids in determining weaknesses in the water system.
- Helps to identify closed valves and weak flows in the water main.
- Verifies ample water flow for firefighting.



The Village encourages residents and businesses to sign up for the community information service designed to deliver important and timely information. This service delivers trustworthy and important neighborhood-level public safety and community notifications by e-mail and text message. If you have not yet signed up to receive these messages, please visit www.prairiedusac.net and click on the Nixle image.

As a result of hydrant flushing, residents in the immediate vicinity may experience temporary discoloration of their water. This discoloration is harmless, and generally consists of precipitates which do not affect the safety of water consumption. If you notice that your water is discolored, you can clear this issue by running all water faucets inside your home for approximately 15 minutes, or until the water clears. If water does not clear, please contact the Village at 643-4769. It is important you **do not wash laundry during flushing in your neighborhood** or while water is cloudy or discolored. Please wait until water is clear before laundering. The Village does not accept responsibility for clothing reported as soiled or damaged when washed in cloudy or discolored water.
