FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Village of Prairie du Sac Water Utility tentatively plans to flush fire hydrants **May 13, 2024 to May 31, 2024**, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. It may be necessary to adjust these dates due to weather conditions. The process of periodically “flushing” fire hydrants is an important preventative maintenance activity to ensure the integrity of the water system and deliver the highest quality water to our customers. The Village flushes hydrants twice a year, usually in the spring and fall. Hydrant flushing serves the following purposes:



- Flushes sediments from mainline pipes, which enhances water quality.
- Verifies the proper operation of fire hydrants and valves.
- Aids in determining weaknesses in the water system.
- Helps to identify closed valves and weak flows in the water main.
- Verifies ample water flow for firefighting.

As a result of hydrant flushing, residents in the immediate vicinity may experience temporary discoloration of their water. This discoloration is harmless, and generally consists of precipitates which do not affect the safety of water consumption. If you notice that your water is discolored, you can clear this issue by running all water faucets inside your home for approximately 15 minutes, or until the water clears. If water does not clear, please contact the Village at (608) 643-4769. It is important you **do not wash laundry during flushing in your neighborhood** or while water is cloudy or discolored. Please wait until water is clear before laundering. The Village does not accept responsibility for clothing reported as soiled or damaged when washed in cloudy or discolored water.

Parking/Storage of Recreational Vehicles and Trailers

The Village's Code of Ordinances allows parking of these campers, RV's, snowmobiles, ATV, boats and similar recreational vehicles inside any enclosed structure that conforms to zoning requirements.

Parking in the front or street side yard, shall be permitted on paved surface only and parked perpendicular to the nearest curb. In other yards, it is permitted on a paved surface, well-drained gravel surface, or other ground surface that is well-drained; where soil erosion does not result; grass, weeds, and other growth under the vehicle cut; and all debris and rubbish cleaned up and removed. Regardless of the surface on which it is placed, no recreational vehicle be permitted that is leaking or otherwise resulting in a threat to public health or safety.

Parking must be set back a minimum of 5 feet from all front, side and rear lot lines.



The item must belong to the property owner or tenant of the property. The recreational vehicle shall not be connected to sanitary sewer or a private on-site waste treatment system at any time, and shall not be connected to electricity or water except for maintenance and for use as a temporary dwelling for no more than 14 days per calendar year or less.

The Village's Code of Ordinances states recreational vehicles and trailers may not park longer than four (4) hours on a street without a permit obtained from the Village. This temporary permit shall allow the

permittee to park on a Village street for up to five (5) days for a \$10.00 fee (limit four permits per calendar year). Parking in the street for longer than four hours without a permit can result in a citation of \$100 plus court fees, assessments, and costs.

Things to Know When Planning Garage Sales, Yard Sales and Similar Merchandise Sales

- Garage/Yard sale signs may not have an area more than six square feet with a maximum of two faces and shall list the address of the sale.



- No garage sale sign may be located on utility poles, traffic signs, trees, private property without owner's permission or within the public right-of-way (*this includes the terrace area or area between the sidewalk and curb, where there is no sidewalk, the area from the curb line to the edge of the right-of-way, approxi-*

mately 12-13 ft., shall be deemed to be a terrace area). Signs improperly placed will be removed without warning.

- No garage sale sign shall be displayed more than three days before the sale or one day following the sale.
- No more than one garage sale sign may be located at the sale site and no more than two garage sale signs may be located off the site, except that two signs are permitted on corner lots, one facing each street.
- Garage sales may be conducted between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. A sale shall last no longer than four consecutive days. Sales may be held no more than twice per year at any residence, and for a total of not more than six days in that year.
