The Public Works/Utilities staff will only be responding for emergency and safety issues. All other services, such as yard waste and brush curbside pickup, are suspended until further notice. Yard waste and brush can still be dropped off 24/7 at the Brush and Compost Site (1005 19th Street, between Northland Doors and Recob’s). Village of Prairie du Sac Announces Resources for Businesses in Response to COVID-19

At is April 14, 2020 meeting, the Village of layoffs, revenue reduction, inability to pay Prairie du Sac Board of Trustees authorized a number of responses to COVID-19. costs, and other financial losses resulting from their compliance with the State of Wisconsin Safe at Home order with funds being used for payroll, utilities, product loss, incurring expenses, property taxes, and/or rent/mortgage. One of the items is a short term loan for businesses. The Board of Trustees authorized up to \$40,000 for a Small Business Emergency Assistance Fund Loan Program to provide loans with a maximum amount of \$2,000, at 0% interest, for employers with 25 or less employees, to be repaid on or before March 19, 2021. Concerned About Paying Your Utility Bill?

The Village of Prairie du Sac Utilities urges utility customers concerned about being able to pay their bill to apply for Energy Assistance. The deadline of May 15, 2020 has been eliminated due to COVID-19. Funding is available to help income-qualified residential customers pay their electric bills, including those whose employment has been impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency.

In Wisconsin, energy assistance eligibility requirements were adjusted to more efficiently assist families impacted by COVID-19 and are now based on the household's previous month of income, rather than the former requirement of the previous three-month's income. Energy Assistance provides bill pay support for heating costs, electric costs, and energy crises.
