#### SEC. 8-2-1 MANNER OF OPERATION RESTRICTED.

- (a) Bicycles. No bicycle shall be allowed to proceed in any street in the Village by inertia or momentum with the feet of the rider removed from the bicycle pedals. No rider of a bicycle shall remove both hands from the handlebars or practice any trick or fancy riding in any street in the Village nor shall any bicycle rider carry or ride any other person so that two persons are on the bicycle at one time, unless a seat is provided for a second person.
- (b) Skateboards, Roller Blades/Skates/Skis and Scooters. No person shall skateboard, roller blade/skate/ski, ride scooters or other similar play vehicles on any street except for the purpose of crossing a street on skateboards, roller blades/skates/skis, scooters or other similar play vehicles. No person shall skateboard, roller blade/skate/ski, ride scooters or other similar play vehicles on any private property without permission from the owner.

#### SEC. 8-2-2 LIGHTING EQUIPMENT.

No person shall operate a bicycle upon a highway during the hours of darkness unless equipped as required in sec. 346.81, Wis. Stats.

#### SEC. 8-2-4 PARKING A BICYCLE OR PLAY EQUIPMENT.

No person shall leave a bicycle, skateboards, roller blades/skates/skis, scooters or other similar play equipment at such a place or in such a way as to create a hazard to pedestrians, automobile operators or to anyone else.

SEC. 8-2-5 RIDING ABREAST PROHIBITED.

Persons riding or using bicycles or other similar vehicles along or upon any public street, avenue, lane, alley, or other public road, ground or way within the Village shall not ride more than two abreast excepting in a general parade or public demonstration.

SEC. 8-2-6 RULES OF THE ROAD.

The provisions of Ch. 346, Wis. Stats., shall be applicable to the operation of bicycles, skateboards, roller blades/skates/skis, scooters or other similar play equipment operated on public streets, where appropriate.

SEC. 8-2-7 OPERATION ON SIDEWALKS PROHIBITED.

- (a) No person shall ride a bicycle, skateboards, roller blades/skates/skis, scooters or other similar play equipment on the sidewalks in the business district. This area shall include the following streets:
  - (1) Water Street from Prairie Street to Broadway;
  - (2) Galena Street from Water Street to Fourth Street;
  - (3) Park Avenue from Galena Street to Washington Street;
  - (4) Washington Street from Water Street to Third Street;
  - (5) Third Street from Washington Street to Galena Street.
- (b) Where permitted, every person operating a bicycle, skateboards, roller blades/skates/skis, scooters or other similar play equipment upon a sidewalk shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall exercise due care and give an audible signal when passing a bicycle rider or pedestrian proceeding in the same direction.

SEC. 8-2-8 REGISTRATION OF BICYCLES.

No person shall ride, use or permit the use of a bicycle upon any public street, highway or alley in the Village of Prairie du Sac unless the same shall have been licensed and registered at the Sauk-Prairie Police Department. The fee shall be as stated in the Schedule of Fees, and shall be paid to the Sauk-Prairie Police Department. Each bicycle license, when issued, shall be attached to that part of the frame of the bicycle, which is between the seat and pedals. Said license tag shall remain with the bicycle throughout the life of the bicycle. Upon sale or transfer of said bicycle, the new owner shall re-register the bicycle with the Sauk-Prairie Police Department and pay the required fee. License tags shall not be transferable from one bicycle to another. At the time of registration, the serial number, a description of the bicycle, and the name and address of the bicycle owner shall be furnished.
