

Invasive Tree and Shrub Species

The following tree/shrub species are listed as invasive or regulated species under the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Invasive Species Rule – NR 40 (Wis. Admn. Code ch. NR 40).

The species included in this list are not to be planted.

Street Right-of-Way, Street Terrace, Parkway, Boulevard or Other Public Place

Trees, plants or shrubs planted within any terrace, parkway, boulevard or other public property without the authorization and approval of the Village Forester may be removed. Permit applications can be obtained at the Village Hall or on the Village's website.

No person shall plant any Catalpa, Chinese Elm, White Poplar, Lombardy Poplar, or any fruit or nut tree in or upon any public street, parkway, boulevard or other public place within the Village unless the person shall first secure written permission from the Village Forester, who shall not approve any such planting if in his/her opinion said tree will constitute a nuisance to the public or adjoining property owners or interfere with the safety of the public or the operation of any sewer or water system. The Village Forester shall cause the removal of any tree planted in violation.

New street trees shall be:

10 feet from

- **Intersecting driveway**
- **Walkway**
- **Fire hydrant**
- **Back of street sign**
- **Sewer or water lateral**

25 feet from

- **Streetlight**
- **Front of street sign**
- **Right of way of an intersecting local street**

50 feet from

- **Right of way of an intersecting arterial or collector street**
