UTILITY PAYMENTS WITH ONLINE BANKING

Just a reminder that when you pay with on-line banking from your banking institution, they then print a check and send it to us by mail. Please allow enough time for mail delivery of these checks to avoid late fees or possible service interruption.

The Village of Prairie du Sac requires sidewalks (including crosswalk entrances) to be cleared of snow and ice within 12 hours after the snow or ice ceases to fall by the adjacent property owner/occupant. If ice has formed on any sidewalk so that it cannot be immediately removed, the sidewalk shall be kept sprinkled with salt, sawdust or sand. If walks are not maintained as required, the Village is authorized to clear it and the cost of doing so will be charged against the property, if not paid, will be assessed to the property’s tax bill. In addition to abatement costs, violators are subject to fines. A separate offense shall be deemed committed during each day during which a violation occurs or continues. Please report un-cleared sidewalks to the Sauk Prairie Police Department by calling 643-2427.



The Village of Prairie du Sac requires that all vehicles be off the streets once there is a snow accumulation of 2 inches of snow to allow for snow plowing. This parking restriction remains in effect for 48 hours after the snow has stopped or until the streets are cleared. During this restriction, parking is available in the following municipal lots: Water Street, Third Street, Fourth Street, Washington Street and Galena Street Public Lots.

The Village of Prairie du Sac also prohibits the blowing, pushing or otherwise depositing of snow or ice upon any streets or alleyways. This includes pushing and/or piling snow across the street from your property.



Per Village ordinance, it is the owner/occupant responsibility to keep mailboxes free and clear of snow. If you house number is on your mailbox, you must keep it clear of snow so that the number is plainly visible.

Residents/Property Owners are encouraged to adopt a fire hydrant by keeping it clear of snow and ice so that it is easily accessible in an emergency.



During winter months, refuse items including garbage and recycling put out for collection shall not be placed on top of snow banks, nor shall they be placed in the street or alley ways. Instead, residents and businesses are encouraged to either shovel out an area behind the curb to place the items or place them in your driveway immediately behind the curb line. Placing items on the snow banks has the potential to cause injury to collection employees. Placing the items within the street or alley ways can hinder snow plowing operations, cause damage to equipment and/or property or injuries.

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

SEWER LATERAL OWNERSHIP

The property owner or customer owns and maintains the sanitary sewer service lateral all the way from the dwelling to the Village of Prairie du Sac's main within the street. Unlike water laterals where a clear demarcation of ownership can be achieved at the curb stop located at or near the property line, no similar physical feature is typically present on a sewer lateral. Sewer laterals are also more prone to blockages (accumulation of grease, tree roots, hair or other solid materials that are too large for wastewater pipes to handle). Making the customer responsible for the entire lateral provides the customer with an incentive to care for the operation and use of the lateral. It also prevents questions regarding who is responsible for roots and other issues occurring at, or near, the property line. According to the Wisconsin Public Service Commission (PSC), the vast majority of the over 600 sewer systems in the state make the property owner or customer responsible for ownership as well as maintenance of the entire sewer lateral.
