
What is on the Village Board Agenda?

For more convenience, you can request to have one or both e-mailed to you.


To sign-up, visit www.prairiedusac.net and click on "E-mail Village Board Agenda Request" under "Village Meetings" at the top of the screen. Then complete the simple form. To verify your e-mail address, you will receive a confirmation e-mail from the Village. To sign-up to receive Plan Commission meeting agenda's, follow similar steps by clicking on "E-mail Plan Commission Agenda Request" under "Village Meetings" at the top of the screen.

Agendas are normally e-mailed five days prior to the meeting.



RIVERWALK PARK AND OVERLOOK

Work is underway on the village's new park – Riverwalk Park and Overlook. In 2018, the Village Board endorsed the conceptual plans for the development of a downtown riverfront park to create a portal between the downtown and both the Great Sauk State Trail and the Wisconsin River. In developing the plans for the park, the village worked with various stakeholders of which included, but was not limited to, Ferry Bluff Eagle Council, River Arts, Inc., Sauk Prairie Area Chamber of Commerce, Ruth Culver Community Library, Sauk County Great Sauk Trail Commission, Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the University of Wisconsin-Madison Department of Planning and Landscape Architecture.



The project, located next to the Ruth Culver Community Library, includes the reconstruction of the Water Street Parking Lot. The parking lot improvements will consist of new pavement, stormwater improvements, improved circulation, electric vehicle charging stations, new lighting, and new landscaping. A retaining wall dating back to when the parking lot was constructed in 1953 will be replaced with a new wall. The project includes a reconstructed and larger eagle overlook, originally built in 1990. The park will include a performance area, a playground, benches, tables, a viewing space near the river, removal of invasive trees and vegetation and establishment of native species, and more.

Financial contributions to the project have been provided by the Federal Recreational Trails Program; the Wisconsin Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program - Urban Rivers Subprogram; Village of Prairie du Sac Tax Incremental District No. 6; Ferry Bluff Eagle Council; Sauk County Community Development Grant; Sauk Prairie Community Club; and WPPI Energy, Inc.

 for the
 November
 Election**

September 17, 2020: This is the deadline for Wisconsin's city, village and town clerks to mail absentee ballots for November 3 to registered voters with absentee requests on file. Ballots will be mailed as soon as they are received from the County. Ballots can only be mailed and are not allowed to be hand-carried out of the building.

October 14, 2020: Your last chance to register by mail or online. Visit <https://myvote.wi.gov> to complete the registration process in minutes or visit the municipal clerk's office at 335 Galena Street.

October 15 to October 30, 2020: During this closed registration period, you must register to vote at the municipal clerk's office.

October 20, 2020: The first day that the municipal clerk will offer in-person absentee voting at the Village Hall. Our hours for voting will be Monday through Friday from 9am to 5pm.

October 27, 2020: Practical deadline for voters to return their mail absentee ballots to their municipal clerk's office. The US Postal Service recommends allowing one week for your completed absentee ballot to be delivered to your municipal clerk's office. After this date, voters should find other options for returning their absentee ballot, which include delivering it to their municipal clerk's office or our secure drop box located near the entrance. Most voters can also deliver their ballot to their polling place by 8 p.m. on Election Day.

October 29, 2020: The legal deadline for most voters to request an absentee ballot to be received by mail.

October 30, 2020: Final day to register to vote at your municipal clerk's office.

October 30, 2020: The last day that you will be able to in-person absentee vote at the Village of Prairie du Sac Village Hall.

November 3, 2020: Election Day. Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., and voters who are returning an absentee ballot to their polling place must get it there by 8 p.m.

This is subject to change pending any unforeseen circumstances.

Items accepted for **no charge** include: pesticides, cleaners, paint, batteries, light bulbs, motor oil, and a wide variety of electronics.
